SRG Global picked for Pilbara Minerals gig as part of \$150m contract wins

SRG Global has added \$150 million worth of work to the orderbook after lining up new contracts in mining, infrastructure and transport.

The Subiaco-based contractor confirmed the multiple contract wins to the market on Thursday. Among the work was an infrastructure contract to build a tailings damn at Pilbara Minerals' Pilgangoora lithium operation in the Pilbara.

Work is set to start under the contract this month and be done within 14 months.

Genesis Minerals has picked SRG for construction work, dishing out a four-month regional road diversion contract — also starting this month — at the gold miner's operations in Leonora.

Fellow gold miner Evolution Mining also recruited SRG, contracting them to provide drill and blast work and maintenance services at its Cowal gold operations in New South Wales, with works already underway.

SRG will also deliver asset integrity and reliability term contracts for Dampier Salt at their operations in the Pilbara, BP at the Kwinana energy hub and NRG at Gladstone in Queensland, among others. The length of the contracts ranges between three to five years.

A specialist inspection works contract at the West Gate Bridge in Victoria was also awarded to SRG.

SRG's managing director David Macgeorge said the company continued to score work across a broad range of sectors.

Shares in SRG were off 0.6 per cent to close at 80¢.
