

## PROJECT REMEDIATE INDUSTRY UPDATE

### CLADDING PRODUCT SAFETY PANEL REPORT 2 RELEASED – 29 April 2022

**General statement: for general use.**

The NSW Cladding Product Safety Panel (CPSP) released an updated list of materials that may now be considered for the state's Project Remediate program. The program will help eligible apartment building owners with suitable product selections to replace high-risk cladding on their buildings.

Following testing of two types of Bonded Laminate Materials (BLMs) the report advises that favourable results were achieved. The CPSP has provided the testing methodology that was deployed. No specific product brand was named or endorsed.

At a vendor briefing, all suppliers were advised that they will need to undertake their own testing via a NATA approved laboratory. When individual product testing information and the substance of installed warranties are reviewed, specific products may be endorsed for Project Remediate.

The NSW Project Remediate program has adopted best practice product and design principles that will be incorporated into a remediation Pattern Book to assist designers and contractors. Building owners will achieve a Project Remediate Assurance certificate.

It is not intended for Project Remediate to set industry-wide practice standards, that is a market choice. While the materials have passed testing and have been accepted by the CPSP, no individual product has been endorsed, nor should be implied.
